

WHO WE ARE

Team Kenya is a North East based charity which was officially founded in 2008 by Valerie Wilson, a geography teacher and senior manager working in a secondary school in Newcastle Upon Tyne. Valerie has worked with the community in Ndhiwa since 1999, focusing on school partnerships and curriculum exchange. In 2008 Valerie left her job in teaching to establish Team Kenya.

Our mission is to work with partners to educate girls, empower women and transform communities in western Kenya through sustainable development practices and education.

In the UK we partner with local schools and colleges to help raise funding to support Twende Pamoja, our partner organisation in Kenya, so they can deliver their community-led programs in Ndhiwa.





WHY OUR WORK IS IMPORTANT

In Homa Bay County, 63% of people live in extreme poverty, and in Ndhiwa only 15% of children progress to secondary school, very few of whom are girls. We are passionate about ensuring that girls receive quality education, allowing them to access qualifications that will improve their quality of life, and help transform their communities.

In the UK, we believe it is essential students are educated on global citizenship in line with the Sustainable Development Goals. In our experience, schools appreciate help in identifying and developing opportunities to embed this within their curriculum and provide a more diverse education for their students.



OUR HOLISTIC MODEL

1. Advocacy for Safe Communities

Girls and young women are equal and respected members of society who are safe at home, in school and in their community.

We will achieve this by:

- Community training in gender equality & children's rights
- Support & advice for victims
- Community advocacy
- Mixed gender football
- Girls' advocates in schools
- Girls' Support Groups

2. Girls Education

Girls gain access to and attain a good quality education and have relevant skills and knowledge to fully participate in economic social and cultural life.

We will achieve this by:

- Resources for primary schools
- Teacher training
- Alternative behavior management training
- Girls' Support Group
- Homework club
- · Family income generation for school fees
- Learning Resource Centre
- Income-generating farms for schools
- Youth groups & peer mentors

3. Economic Sustainability and Food Security

Families have improved food security and develop sustainable economic enterprises to support girls.

We will achieve this by:

- Demonstration farms
- Small loans for women
- Agricultural training for women
- Provision of tools for women
- Beekeeping
- Co-operative farms
- · Table-banking savings schemes · Community advocacy with parents, teachers and community leaders
 - Income-generating farms

The programmes we support in Ndhiwa have 3 focus areas:

- 1. Advocacy for safe communities
- 2. Girls Education
- 3. Economic sustainability and food security

Since Team Kenya was founded, we have impacted over 60,000 people. We currently support 500 vulnerable girls across 16 partner schools in Ndhiwa by providing them with the resources needed to attend school. We also offer extra tuition in our Learning Resource centre, counselling sessions and girls support groups, as well as safe spaces for those who need it. We use a holistic approach to involve whole communities in education and gender equality.



SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

Learn about exciting topics -

We can help provide you with learning resources from the British Council on important topics such as gender equality, climate change, and international development. These can include real-life case studies from Twende Pamoja to help inform course work.

School trips to Kenya -

Teachers can arrange the fantastic opportunity to visit their partner school in Kenya. This is regularly found to be a highly rewarding experience for staff and students. We have facilitated many successful trips using our accommodation at Karibuni Eco-Cottages.

Team Kenya has developed partnerships with over 19 schools, colleges and universities in the UK. Many of our partnerships have taken place as part of the British Council connecting classrooms program, which provides lots of different opportunities for your staff and students.



Partner with a school in Ndhiwa -

We can partner you with a school in Ndhiwa so you can directly contact them via zoom calls, videos, emails, or letters. You can use your partnership to work together on curriculum activities or joint projects. Connecting students in the UK and Kenya allows them to learn about each other's lives and develop their communication skills.

Fundraising -

You can raise awareness for Team Kenya and organise fundraising activities to support the schools and community in Ndhiwa, while simultaneously developing your students' creativity, management, and leadership skills.

Example: Longbenton School


